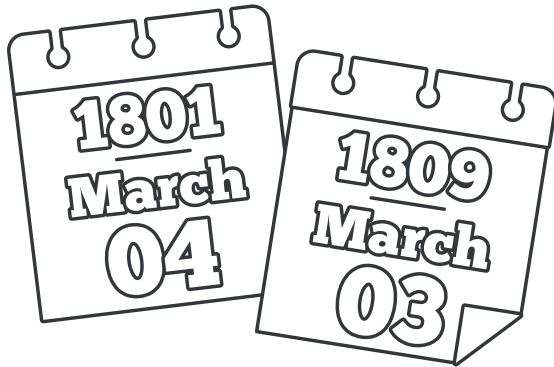

Thomas Jefferson (April 13, 1743 – July 4, 1826) was the third President of the United States from March 4, 1801, to March 3, 1809

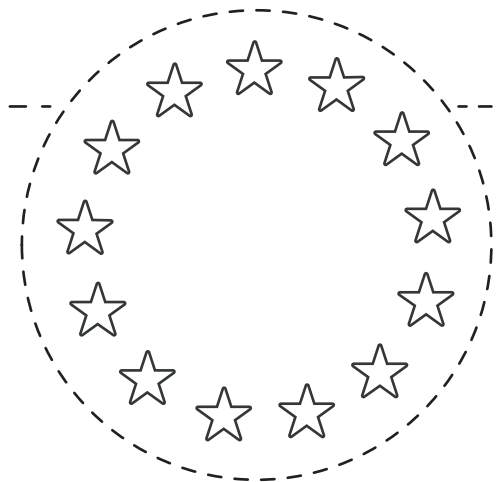
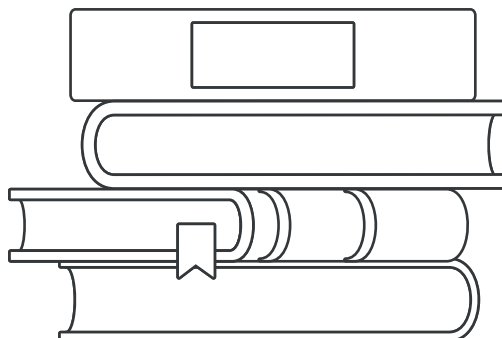


He wrote the Declaration of Independence and the Statute of Religious Freedom.

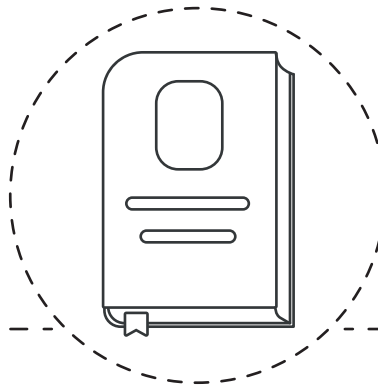
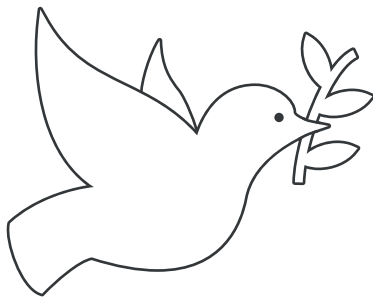


## 10 Fun Facts About Thomas Jefferson

Jefferson made the Louisiana Purchase, which doubled the size of the United States. Before him, the country ended at the Mississippi River.

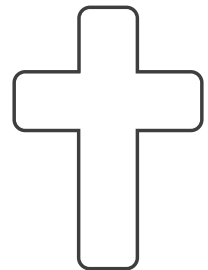


During his second term, Great Britain and France were at war, so Jefferson worked hard to keep the U.S. out of the war.
