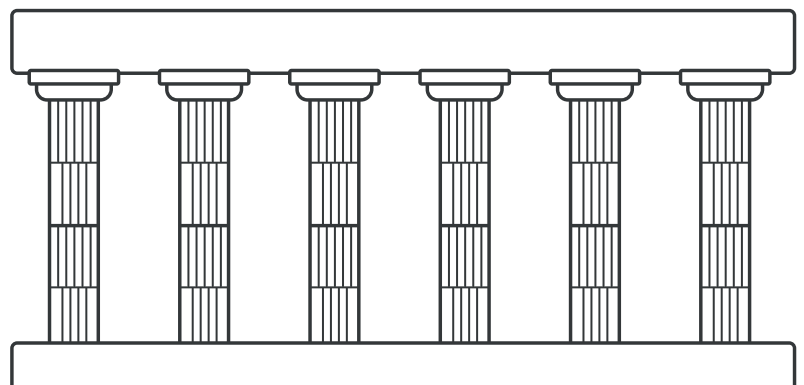
Ancient Greeks called him Poseidon, but the Roman equivalent to Poseidon is Neptune.

You can visit the Temple of Poseidon in Cape Sounion, Greece, one of the most important monuments from Greece's ancient times.



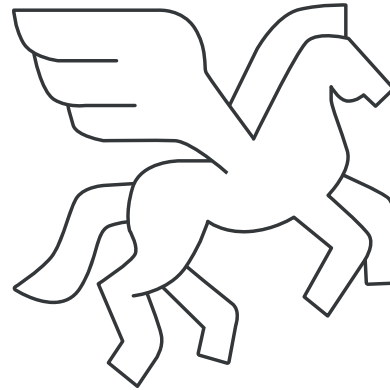
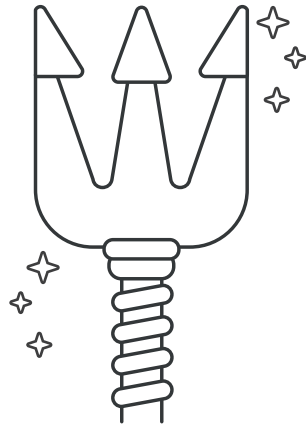
During the Trojan War, Poseidon fought on behalf of the Greeks because he held a grudge against Laomedon, the Trojan king.

Poseidon's trident resembles a fisherman's spear and represents his power over the sea.

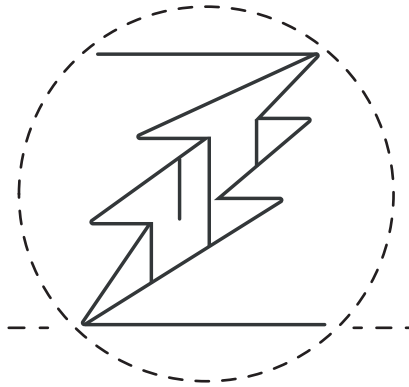


The winged horse Pegasus was the offspring of the god Poseidon and the gorgon Medusa.

His sacred animals were the bull, horse and dolphin.

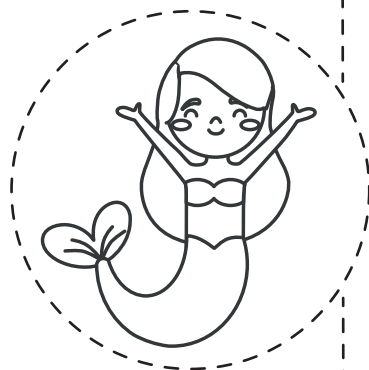


He was also known as the Earth Shaker because it was believed he was the cause of such disasters, striking the Earth with his trident.
