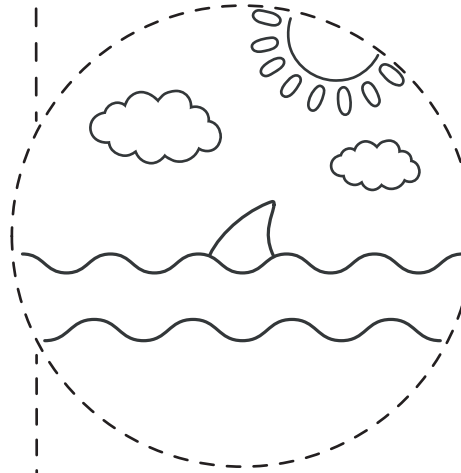
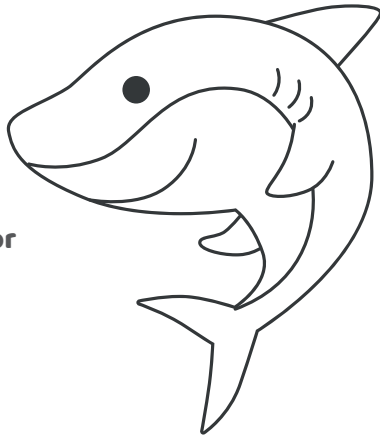

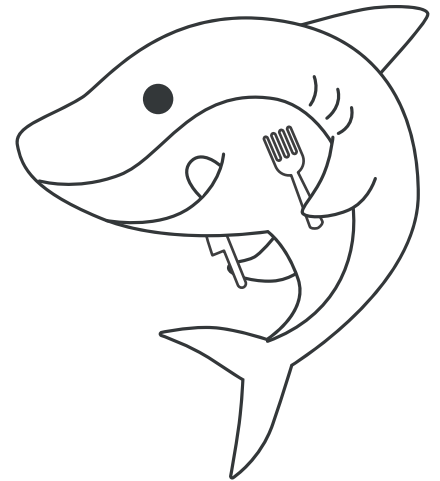
## 10 Fun Facts About Great White Sharks!

Great white sharks, also known as the white sharks, white pointers, or simply great whites, are a species of large mackerel shark.

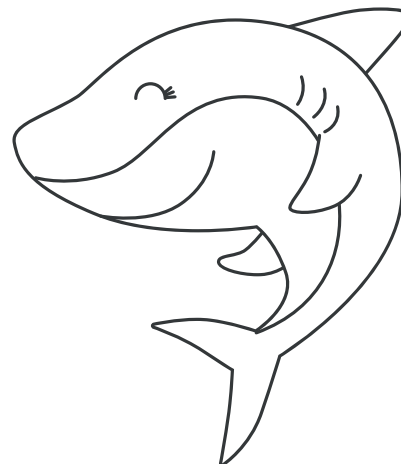
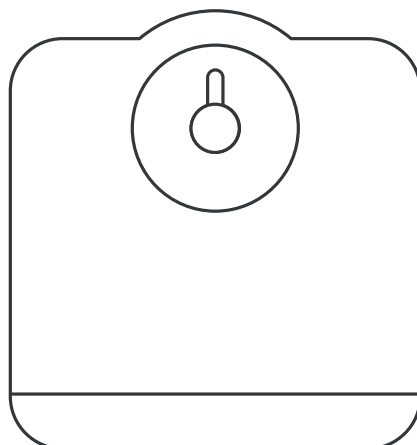


They are found in the coastal surface waters of all the major world's oceans.

They can grow up to 20 feet in length and weigh more than 4,400 pounds.



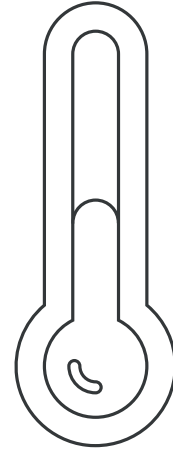
The largest great white shark on record was a female shark named "Deep Blue." She was over 20 feet long and weighed an estimated 2.5 tons.

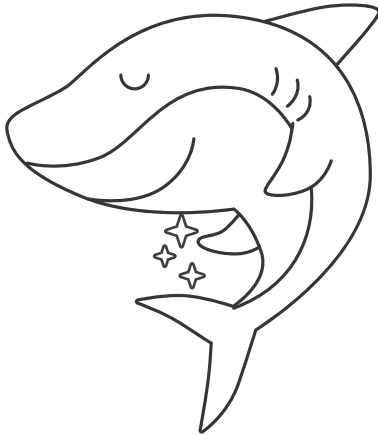

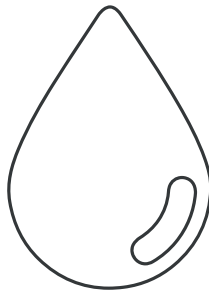
They are cold-blooded and their body temperature adapts to the surrounding water.
