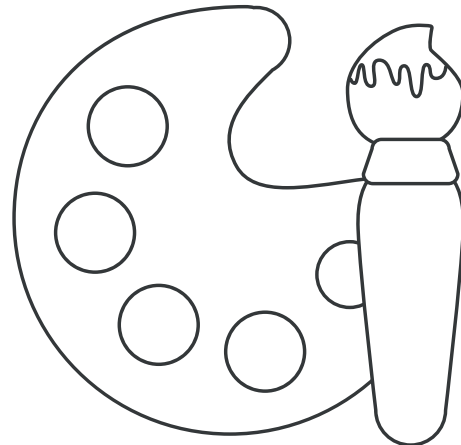


10 Fun Facts About Leonardo Da Vinci!

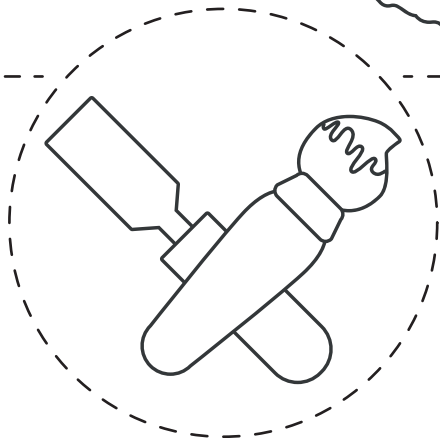

Leonardo did not have a last name as we know them nowadays. Da Vinci literally translates to "of Vinci," which is his hometown.

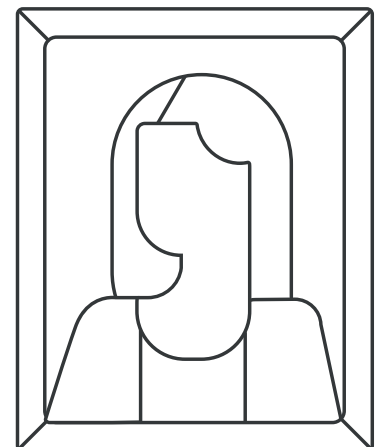


Leonardo da Vinci was one of the first Italians to use oil paints.



He received little formal education but was apprenticed to the artist Andrea del Verrocchio in Florence, where he learned the techniques of painting, sculpture, and other arts.

Among his most famous works are the Mona Lisa and The Last Supper, considered masterpieces of Western art.

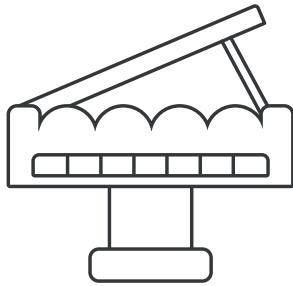
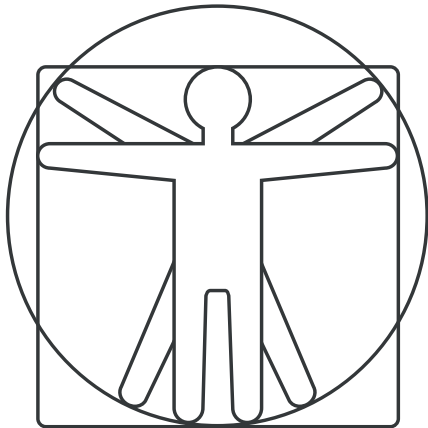


10 Fun Facts About Leonardo Da Vinci!

His left hand was dominant and often wrote in mirror script, a form of writing that can only be read with a mirror.



The Vitruvian Man is a famous drawing by Da Vinci that depicts the ideal proportions of the human body, based on the writings of the Roman architect Vitruvius.



He invented musical instruments like the viola organista.

He also composed music, such as operas, oratorios, masses, and motets. Sadly, many of Leonardo's musical compositions have been lost.



While working for the King of France, Leonardo had his own workshop in the castle of Clos-Lucé, where he continued to create new works of art until his death in...
