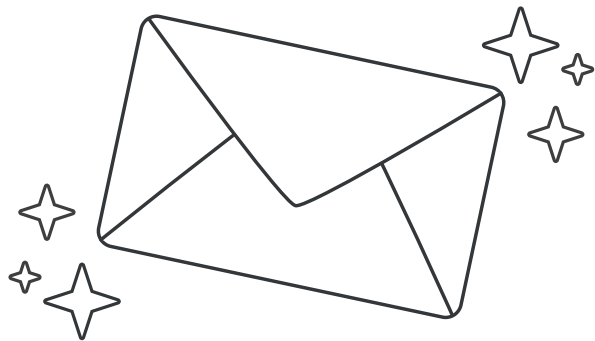

Hermes is the messenger of the Greek Gods.



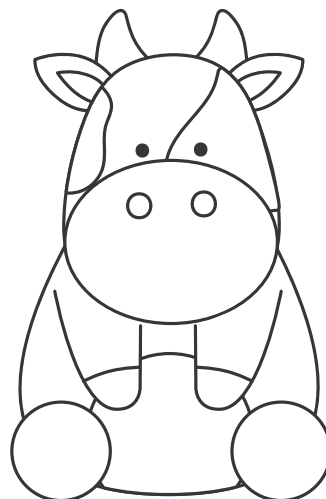
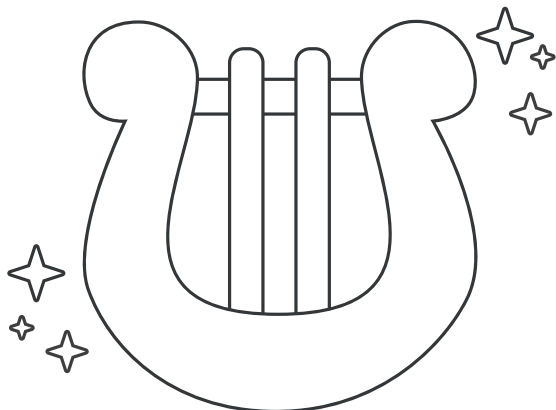

Hermes invented the musical instrument called the lyre.



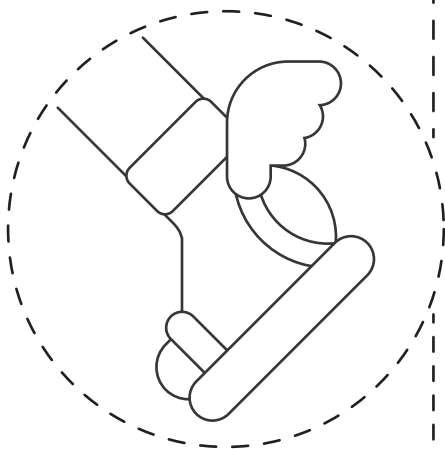

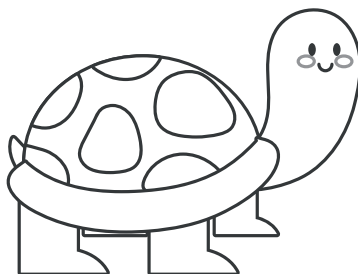
10+ Fun Facts About Hermes!

As the god of music, Apollo is often shown holding a golden lyre or the cithara, a musical instrument similar to the guitar.



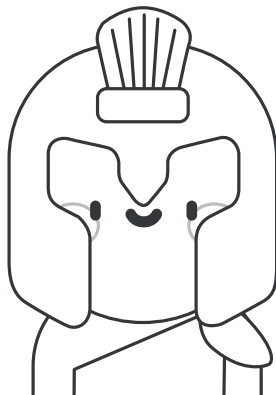
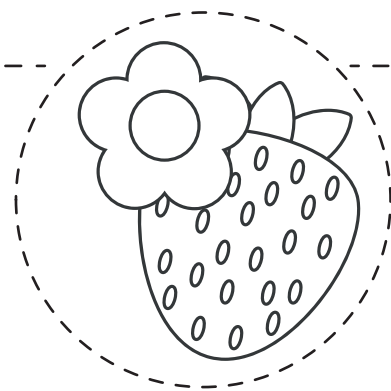
Hermes is one of the 12 Olympian Gods.
