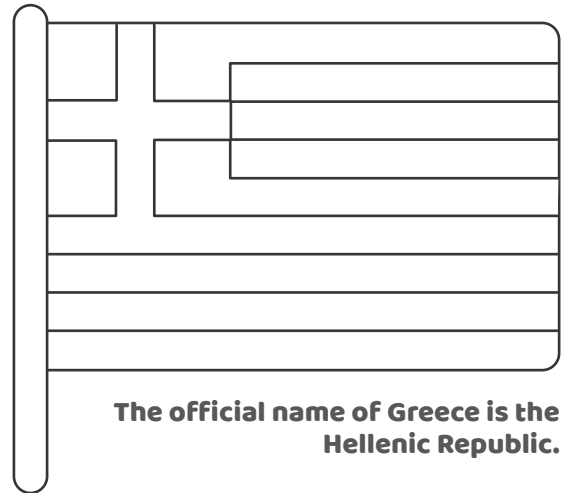

Greece is a peninsular country in Southeast Europe, bordering the Ionian Sea and the Mediterranean Sea, between Albania and Turkey.



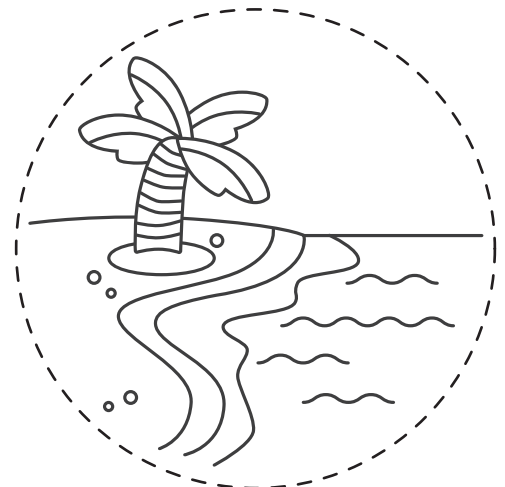
The official name of Greece is the Hellenic Republic.

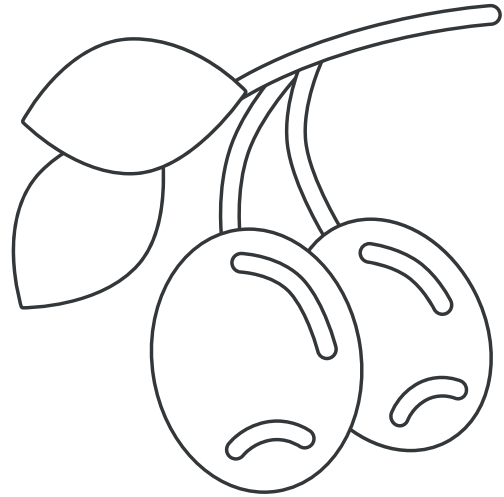




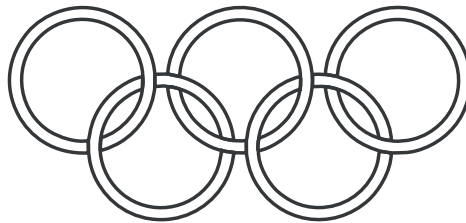
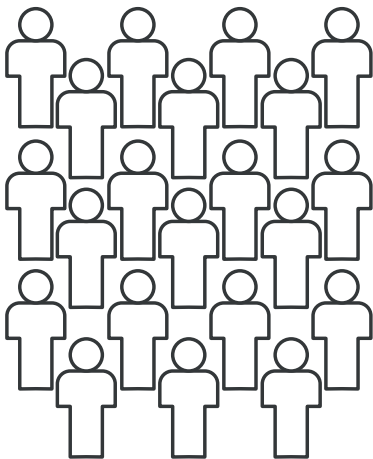

Olive trees are abundant in Greece, and the country is known for its production of olive oil, as well as Feta cheese.

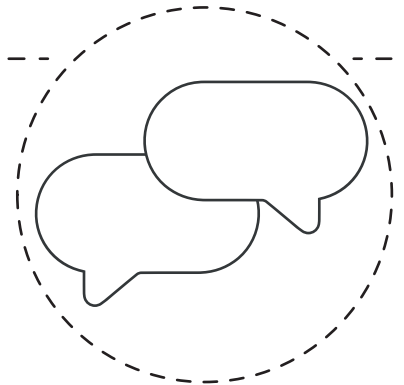


The population of Greece is 10.64 million people.
