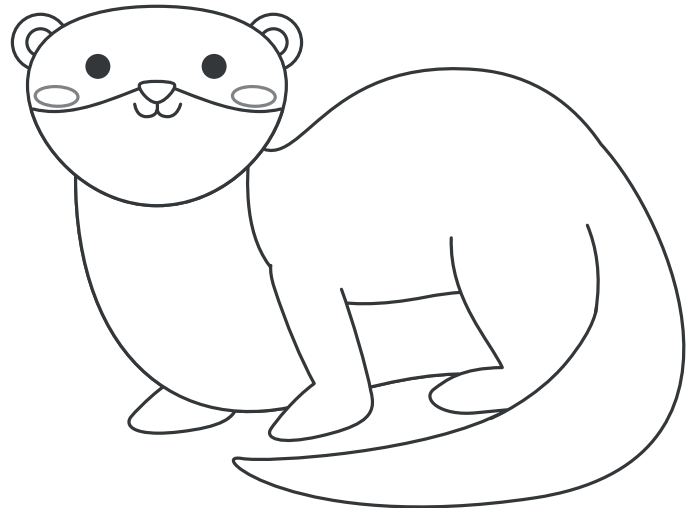




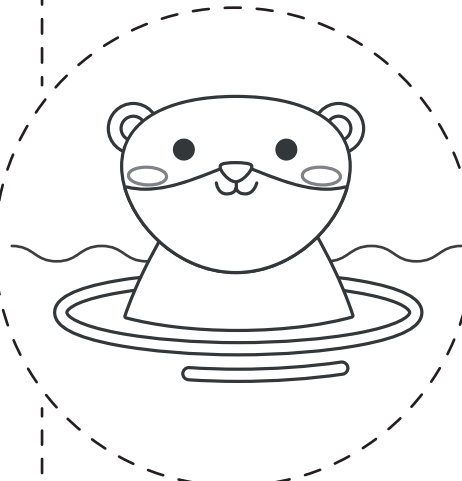
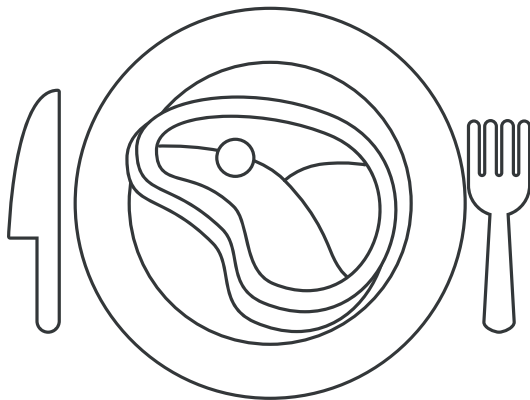

Otters have short legs, long tails, sharp claws, strong forepaws and thick fur.

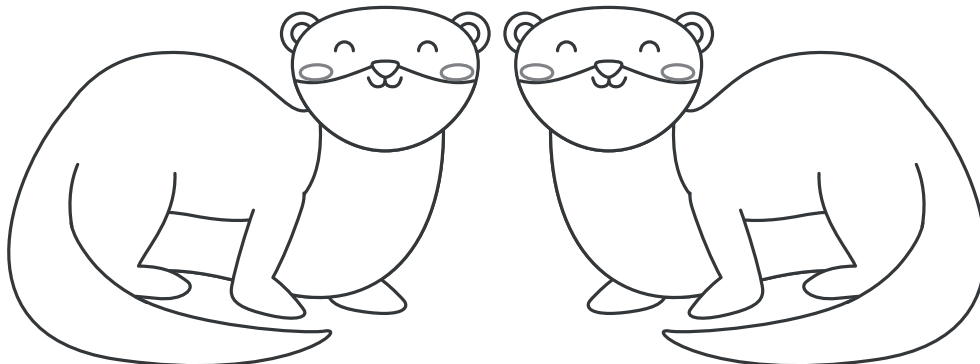


Otters are carnivorous mammals in the subfamily Lutrinae.

A group of otters is called a bevy, family or lodge.



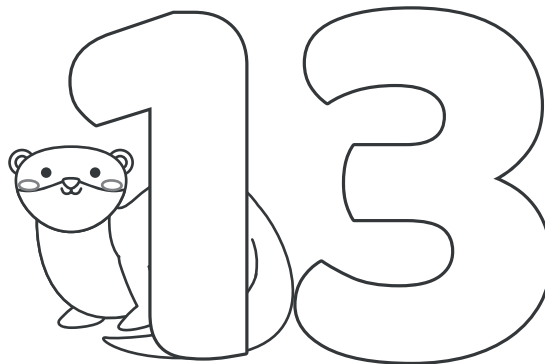

Baby otters are born completely blind and stay blind for the first 30 to 40 days, depending on otter mothers during this time.

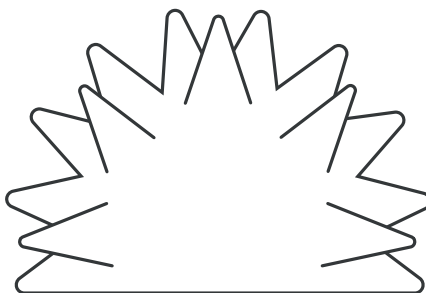

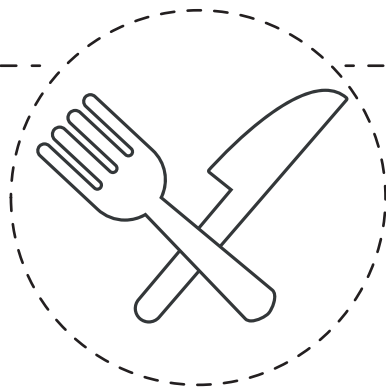
species of otter which live in Europe, Asia, Africa, North, Central and South America.

Sea otters have the densest fur of any animal. Their dense fur contains between 600,000 to 1,000,000 hair follicles per square inch.



Sea otters are keystone species as they help control the sea urchin population along the Pacific coast.

Sea otters' diet consists mostly of sea urchins, clams, mussels, and crabs.



Some otter species are in the endangered species list because of human activities, habitat destruction and water pollution.



Some otters like to sleep holding hands, so they can avoid drifting away from each other and their food source while they sleep.
