Bolivia, officially the Plurinational State of Bolivia, is a landlocked country located in South America.

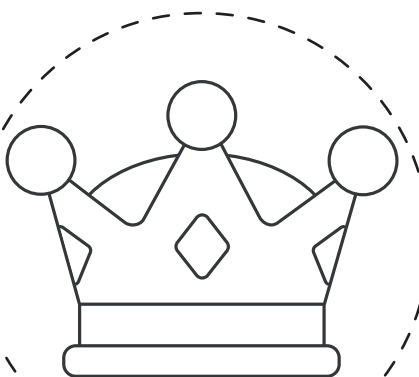
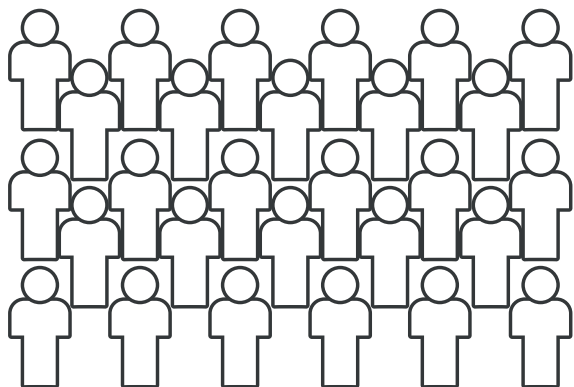


It has two capital cities: La Paz as its administrative capital and Sucre as the constitutional capital.

Bolivia's total population is 12.08 million people, with Santa Cruz, El Alto, La Paz, Cocha, and Oruro being the major cities.



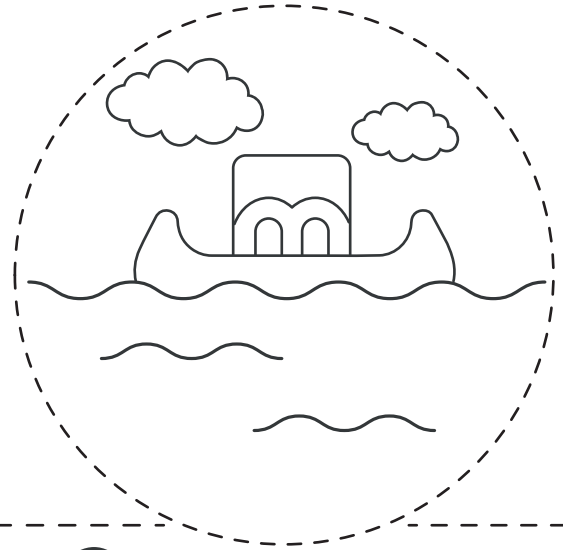
Bolivia was under Spanish rule for over three centuries until it gained independence in 1825, led by Simón Bolívar.



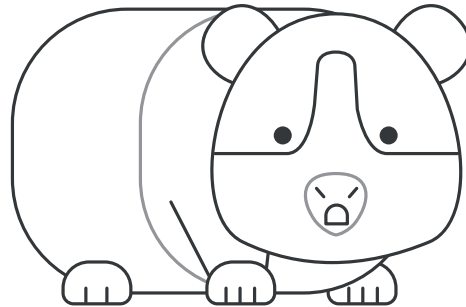

Lake Titicaca, situated in the Andes Mountains, is the world's highest navigable lake and is thought to be there million years old.



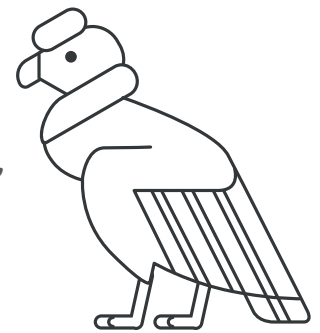
Bolivia has 36 indigenous cultures, with numerous indigenous languages spoken alongside Spanish, and all are official languages.
