



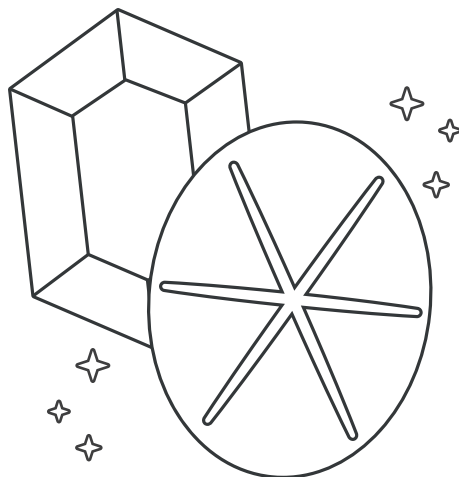

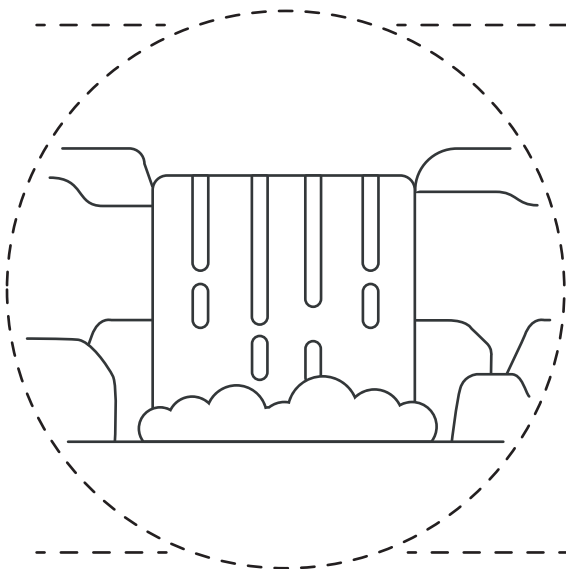
Many people believe the name Idaho comes from a Native American word that means...



but the true origin of the name remains a mystery.

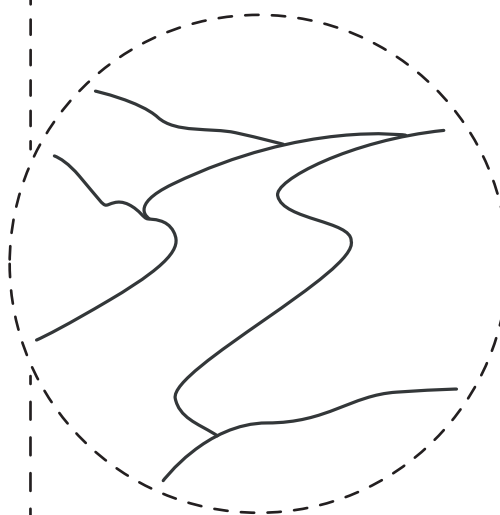
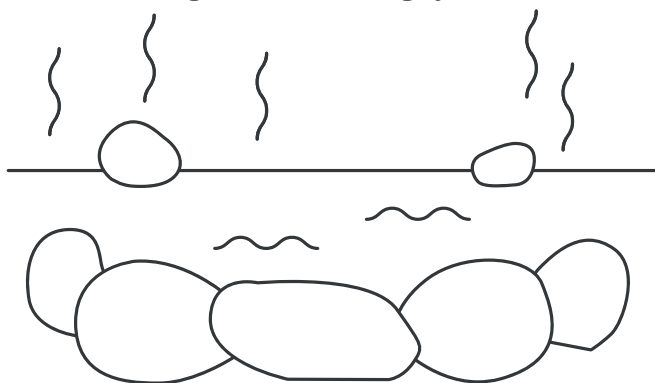


Idaho is known as the "Gem State" because it's a treasure trove of precious stones, including the rare and beautiful Star Garnet.

Idaho has more hot springs than any other state in the United States, including Soda Springs, the largest man-made geyser.



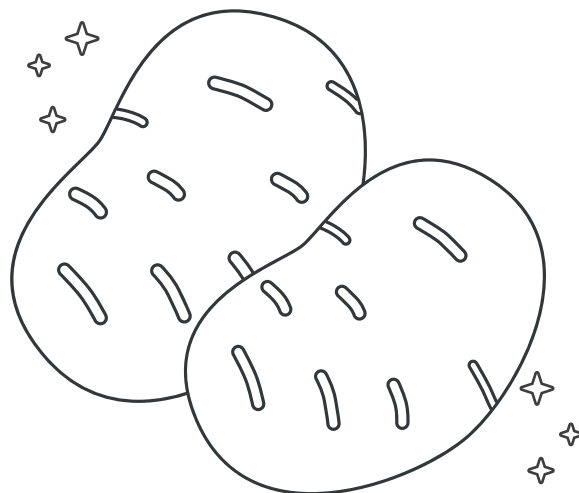
With over 3,000 miles of rivers, the state of Idaho is often called the "Land of Many Waters".



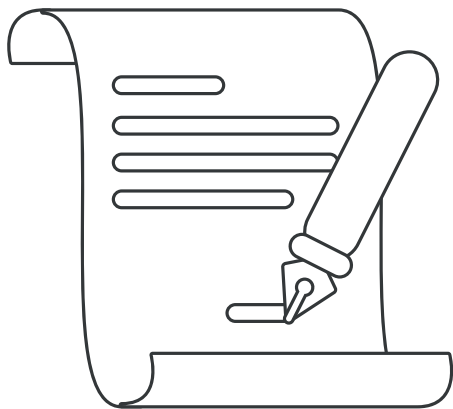

Blackfoot hosts the Idaho Potato Museum, a fun spot that tells the history of the famous potatoes.

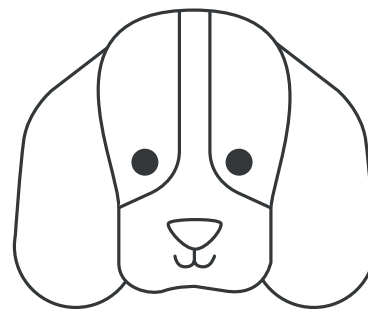


Ski resort Sun Valley was a favorite getaway for the legendary writer Ernest Hemingway, who found inspiration in its stunning surroundings.
